**SIEMENS FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES WINNERS OF
2007 SIEMENS MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS
\$16,000 College Scholarships Awarded to 30 High School Students in 15 States**

ISELIN, NJ, May 23, 2007 — The Siemens Foundation has announced, on behalf of participating Siemens operating companies, the recipients of the 2007 Siemens Merit Scholarships. This year the Siemens Foundation enhanced the Siemens Merit Scholarship program from 16 to 30 scholarships, recognizing twice as many children of Siemens U.S. employees as it has in the past and awarding close to \$500,000 in scholarship funds. Thirty exceptional high school seniors in 15 states — Alabama, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, and Texas — will each receive a college scholarship totaling \$16,000, given in installments of \$4,000 per academic year.

“The Siemens Foundation’s mission is to support and nurture young talent and expanding the Siemens Merit Scholarship program allows us to do just that,” said James Whaley, President, Siemens Foundation.

High school students enter the Siemens Merit Scholarship program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT[®]) and by meeting published entry/participation requirements. Winners are chosen from a group of employees' children who qualify as Merit Program Semifinalists on the basis of their PSAT/NMSQT scores. Family financial circumstances are not taken into consideration in the selection of winners. All phases of the competition, including the selection of winners and payment of awards, are handled by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), an independent not-for-profit organization.

High school students who are children of regular, active, full-time employees of Siemens Corporation and its subsidiaries are eligible for the award. Applicants must meet all requirements for participation in the National Merit Scholarship Program as published in the PSAT/NMSQT Student Bulletin. An applicant must be a U.S. citizen, in the process of becoming a U.S. citizen, a permanent resident, or have applied for permanent residence.
